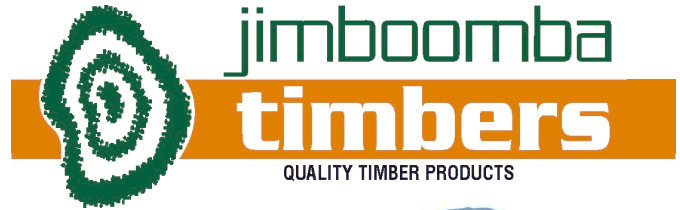

TAMBORINE PONY CLUB [PIC – QGBD3814]

Official/Unofficial One Day Event

Sunday 28 April 2019

8.00am Start (Gear Check starts at 7.30am)

(Qualifier for 2019 PCQ State Horse Trials' Championships)

Venue: Pony Club grounds, 2205 Beaudesert-Beenleigh Road, Tamborine (gates open 6.00am – please follow parking attendant's directions). **Office open at 6.15am**

Entry Fee: \$65 for Classes 1 – 8, \$50 for Class 9 [Beginners] (includes fee for Ambulance on the grounds for XC phase + water for Water Jump + First Aider). Late entries may be accepted - \$20 (but not after draw is done)

Day Yards: \$7 per night for those camping – will be reserved (paid with nomination). Free for others – please use. If you wish a yard to be reserved - \$7 per day (pay with nomination)

Camping: \$22/night/family [Toilet and shower block available – limited power – if have generator, please bring it]

Entries To: ALL nominations are to be lodged online via the PCQ website: www.pcaq.asn.au, and go to Events Online. Each competitor to complete helper's details to ensure helping positions are filled – will be notified if not completed. **NO HELPERS = NO RIDERS**

Entries will be capped at 90 riders with preference to riders in Official classes 1-7 if the need arises.

No transferring of classes after entries close, unless horse has upgraded.

If rider transfers class after walking XC course, then rider will ride HC in new class.

Helpers: All Clubs **MUST** supply a Cross Country Steward, 1 for every three entries or part thereof ie 4 entries = 2 Helpers – will be selected from helpers supplied. If there is a preference to pencil dressage, please indicate this. **NAMES AND MOBILE NUMBERS to be given when nominating. NO HELPERS GIVEN, NO RIDE – competitors and clubs WILL be contacted. We are a small Club and your assistance here is necessary and appreciated.**

Entries Close: Saturday, 20 April 2019

Awards: Rugs to Champion in each Official class – minimum of 5 in a group (or at discretion of committee)
Rosettes to Champion and Reserve Champion in Official and Unofficial classes – sashes 3rd to 5th in each class
Bag of Prydes' EasiFeed to winner of each Unofficial class

Starting Times: Cross country course open for walking @ 3.00pm, Saturday 27 April. Gates will be open at 6.00am, Sunday, 28 April, and cross country course will be open for walking then. XC maps available at Office.

Dressage starts at 8.00am promptly (Dressage Gear Check starts at 7.30am).

Cross Country Jump Stewards' briefing and Riders' briefing at approximately 11.15am – tbc
Showjumping will be held when XC starts – Unofficial 600mm class and Pre-Intro classes and then Intro and 12 Yrs & U (80cm) if time permits

CLASSES: All tests are from 2019 PCQ Dressage Test Book
(tests for Official classes are those used at State Event, 2019)

DISCLAIMER: Neither the organising committee of any contest to which these rules apply, nor the PCQ, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, ground, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

The organising committee reserves the right to: cancel any class or event, combine classes if less than 3 competitors, or divide classes according to the numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting of groups, alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class, and to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason.

RULES:

- **All riders must wear body protectors and medical armbands on cross country phase.**
- **As a condition of entry, each Club MUST provide a XC Jump Steward (or Dressage penciller) for every three entries or part thereof: 4 riders/horses = 2 helpers**
- Run under PCQ rules. Judges' decision is final. **ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE CURRENT 2019 RIDING MEMBERS OF PCQ.**
- Riders **may enter two horses in the same or different classes**
- **Bad language, excessive striking of the horse, abuse or disrespect to the judge or officials will result in disqualification.**
- **Performance cards** are required for Classes 1 – 7 and must be handed to the Office prior to the commencement of event (please complete details of day in your cards before handing it in).
- **HORSE HEALTH DECLARATION MUST BE HANDED IN TO THE OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL, when collecting bib numbers**

Protests: Should be lodged within 30 minutes of the results being posted, or the incident and should be accompanied by a \$50 fee which is refundable only if the protest is upheld.

Refunds: No refunds of entry fee, with the exception of scratchings prior to the commencement of the event AND a written request for a refund of nomination, including a vet/medical certificate or Chief Instructor's report, to be received within 7 days after the event.

Draw: Will be posted on our Facebook page and www.tamborineponyclub.webs.com.

Canteen: All facilities available at clubhouse on the day. (Breakfast available from 6.30/7.00am).

Caller ONLY for Dressage phase of Class 9, Beginners – if required

First Aider is available for Dressage and Showjumping phases, additional to Ambulance for XC phase.

NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS.

BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET



We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY:

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the Organizing Committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering the grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read HHD and ensure:

Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo

Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid materials that could contain disease agents and then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the Organising Committee.

The Property Identification Code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

No horses with signs of illness are to be brought on the grounds.

No communal water troughs are available at this event.

Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses

Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas/or spreading it on the grass. Please use your own rakes/shovels.

Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.

Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN IS A SET OF PREVENTATIVE CONTROL MEASURES AND ACTIONS AIMED AT REDUCING THE RISK OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES AND PESTS ON AND OFF THE VENUE, AND BETWEEN HORSES AT THE VENUE.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT:

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the Organising Committee will implement our Event Biosecurity Plan.

You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organizing committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared by the Organising Committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions, participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of the horse and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease, the owner/lessee will be responsible for all vet costs, and if the venue is locked down and quarantined, will be responsible for all costs associated with this.
